
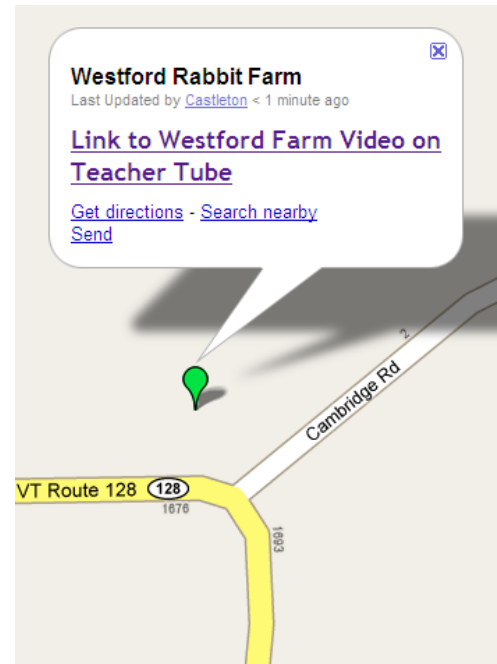


Adding Web Links to a Map in Google Maps and Google Earth

1. In Google Maps

- a. Locate the Web site you wish to link to and copy the URL
- b. Go to Google Maps - <http://maps.google.com/>
- c. Log into Google Maps with your Google Log-in
- d. Click on "My Maps" and click on "Create a New Map"
- e. Give your map a title
- f. Zoom-in to the location where you want to add the link.
- g. Click on the placemark tool and move a placemark to the appropriate spot
- h. Click on the placemark symbol to change it to a different placemark if you wish.
- i. Give the placemark a title and description.
- j. Click on the "Rich text" link and type in the text you would like to use for the link.
- k. Highlight the words and click on the link button

- l. Paste in the URL from the site you wished to link to, click OK, save the map and click "Done."
- m. Now you should be able click on the place mark and the link to go to that site.



2. In Google Earth

- a. Open Google Earth
- b. Add a placemark to your map by clicking on the placemark button and then dragging it to the correct position.
- c. Give the placemark a name.
- d. In the description box copy and paste the following html code:

- e. The section of the code highlighted in yellow is where you will insert your URL. The blue section should be replaced with the text the user will see as the clickable link.
- f. Click OK. When you click on the placemark you will a link that will take you to your chosen Web site.
