### Print Resources In the Library

- Use [Destiny](#) to find circulating books, videos, and EAT tags (electronic access tags.). Try your topic under both subject and keyword. No results? Try a broader topic.
- Use Power Search option. Power search allows you to create a search term from up to three separate words or phrases with Boolean operators—AND, OR, NOT—between them. Instead of “Keyword” option in Power search use “Subject” for each line. E.g. Great Britain--History—Elizabeth; Elizabeth--I,-- Queen of England; Shakespeare, William, --1564-1616; Globe Theator
