

**Dependent Coverage Attestation Form**  
Is Your Child Eligible for Extended Dependency Coverage  
Under the New Federal Health Care Law?

Under the new federal health care reform legislation known as The Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act (PPAC), a young adult under the age of 26 may stay on or be added to a parent's plan regardless of marital status, employment, financial dependence on the subscriber or student status, and regardless of whether he or she is living with the subscriber of the plan or residing in Vermont.

Extended dependency coverage for young adults between the ages of 19 and 26 can only be denied by an employer if the dependents are eligible for health insurance coverage through their employer's plan. In other words if your child has access to a health insurance plan at his or her place of work, he or she may not stay on or re-enroll in your insurance plan under the extended dependency coverage provisions of the PPAC. This exception however only exists until July 1, 2014. Please complete the information below if you wish to provide an adult child(ren) with extended dependency coverage.
