As I am sure you noticed, we no longer have math or word study homework. The students will still be keeping track of what they are reading and for how long. Thank you for helping your child stay organized with homework this year and helping them to practice skills that they are working on in the classroom.

Reading and Writing Workshop

Our poetry unit has come to an end. With this, came our "Poetry Celebration." Students chose their best original poem and published it onto a puzzle. The students also recited their favorite poems written by other authors as well as their own unique poems. It was fun to hear what others in our class liked for poetry and many of us had connections with each other. The students have created some special poems and it was truly a celebration of their work!

Everyday Math

We are into our last unit of Everyday Math for second grade. This unit will focus on the skills that students should have solid. This week we reviewed clock skills. At home, you should practice telling and writing time to the nearest five minutes and pay close attention to the hour hand as it moves throughout the hour. We also continued working on our addition and subtraction with regrouping.

Science

The nasturtiums are growing! In the last three weeks, the students have seen how the water cycle, within their jars, has helped make their seeds begin to grow. We will continue observing them next week before they take them home.
